**Baldernock Parish Church** - The Church of Scotland's provisional Presbytery Plan has earmarked both the Church Hall and the Church for closure under a proposal that St Paul's in Milngavie and Baldernock should form a union based at and using the church buildings in Milngavie. The Kirk Session oppose this proposal and will continue to argue for the current link to remain in place, for the appointment of a new minister to both churches to be progressed and for both churches to be given a reasonable period of time, post the minister being in place, to find a solution which ensure the continuing availability of a place of worship and community space in the Parish .The revised Plan will be published on 1 March and thereafter debated and voted on in mid March. It is unlikely that any final decisions will be made for some time, but it is an unsettling time for all in the community .
