Better Broadband for Baldernock - Twenty-seven addresses in Baldernock can now order a full fibre service as a result of our Community Fibre Partnership, and hundreds more are set to join that list over the summer months. As soon as a property can access the upgraded network the Openreach team will be in touch with voucher holders to encourage them to order a full fibre service according to the terms and conditions of their voucher pledge. Once that full fibre service is installed, the UK Government (DCMS) will ask the voucher holder to confirm they have an active service within the property. Once the project is complete, every home and business included in the Community Fibre Partnership – detailed and listed here – will be able to connect to the new network and obtain all the benefits of full fibre broadband.
