Litter picking in Baldernock – (from local resident) EDC are supporting the Cross Border Roadside Litter Campaign with Keep Scotland Beautiful.

Latest data highlights that 94% of high traffic roadsides are blighted by litter, with 50 tonnes abandoned on Scotland's roadsides each month. And, an overwhelming 91% of adults living in Scotland now agree that roadside litter creates a negative impression of Scotland. EDC closed Boclair Road on Sunday Oct 9th to allow Council operatives to undertake a deep clean tackling litter and flytipping and later in the month residents of Barnellan took advantage of the road closure of Craigmaddie Road to undertake an impromptu litter pick. With the overgrown verges much of the litter was hidden, but still 8 large garden bags of litter were collected. The usual take away rubbish, coffee cup, beer cans and crisp packets were lifted along with an excessive number of pain killer blister packs! They also identified flytipped garden waste and kitchen appliances. A special thanks to the wider Baldernock residents who's wheeliebins were used to accommodate the extra bags ahead of bin collection day.
