Baldernock Church - CLYDE PRESBYTERY MISSION PLAN • CONSULTATION DOCUMENT As many of you will be aware the Church of Scotland is undergoing a radical plan towards reforming parish and presbytery life around mission principles. This will result in a significant reduction in ministers, churches and local resources . New parish groupings, with reduced decision-making bodies, fewer buildings and ecumenical mission will provide the framework for presbytery mission focus The consultation document proposes that all the Milngavie churches (St Lukes, Cairns, St Pauls and Baldernock) will reduce from 3 to 1.5 full time ministerial posts.

The basis for this is , in part , numbers :-Milngavie & Baldernock have a combined parish population of around 14,000. 40% of the population identify with the Church of Scotland. 16% are Roman Catholic and 32% express no religious affiliation. 60% of the population is aged 18-64 and 21% over the age of 65. 18% of the population is under 18. The adjusted population of the area, including Baldernock, is 10,723.

1.5 FTE posts have been allocated to Milngavie and Baldernock. The consultation document also states that buildings should be fit for missional purposes, “well equipped and maintained spaces in the right places”, A robust proposal for the retention of Baldernock Church and Hall has been made to Presbytery and the “consultation” process will continue over the summer. **If you believe Baldernock Church’s survival as a place of active worship in the community is important then whether you are a member, supporter or parishioner or simply don’t want the buildings to close we need your help .** The Presbytery is looking

to finalise the plan by December 2022 with a 5 year progression thereafter. More information available from Isabel Ewing on iee@tcyoung.co.uk

Mapping of Baldernock -Every property in Baldernock has a unique property reference number (UPRN) against the address. It has been found that a few of the actual UPRN addresses, in East Dunbartonshire Council's GIS (Geographic Information System) mapping are wrong, particularly in outlying areas. It is also the case that several properties are wrongly allocated to an incorrect road name. We have already identified some errors and will be submitting a list to EDC. They advise that every property should be allocated to a road name in their mapping. EDC has also advised that if there are issues with a delivery company or emergency service locating a property, if we let them know, they will investigate and liaise with the appropriate parties to alleviate issues.
